(Preaching Christ Always)

Hoping to help keep you informed about what's happening in our Presbytery, here is a brief summary of some of the highlights of our most recent meeting.

The Siouxlands Presbytery, made up of the PCA churches from Duluth, MN, to Spearfish, SD, met for our regularly stated meeting on September 23-24th in Bloomington, MN at Grace Covenant Church. Before the meeting began, there was an evening of Koinonia/Fellowship, in which Jon Medlock and Donald Guthrie, presented the findings of a recent denomination-wide study on Pastoral Wellbeing. Their study showed that 70% of pastors say the demands of ministry inhibit or challenge their spiritual maturity, and 50% of pastors struggle to experience intimacy with Jesus and rarely receive care from his Body. The presentation encouraged the pastors and sessions to work together to build and sustain healthy spiritual environments for the long term good of the church and its leaders. Much of the Presbytery business had to deal with the receiving and dismissal of Pastors from the Presbytery. Rev. John St. Martin announced his resignation from Resurrection Church, Fargo, SD, and long -time missionary of the Presbytery, Rev. Paul Meiners, was designated as Honorably Retired before his membership was transferred to the presbytery where he currently resides. Rev. Bart Moseman, formerly the pastor of CityLife Church, St. Paul, MN, was designated as a minister without a call, as he has accepted a full time position outside of Pastoral Ministry.

The Presbytery received into its membership Rev. Matt Ryman, who has been called to serve a non-denominational church plant in Wayzata, MN, who comes with the hopes of shepherding this plant into the PCA. Matt comes to the Presbytery from Orlando, FL, where he served as senior pastor of University Presbyterian Church. The Presbytery also approved the request of Covenant Life Church in Minneapolis (an Asian American congregation that had been under the oversight of the Korean Central Presbytery, but had never been particularized, and is currently without Pastoral leadership) to be received as a Mission Church of the PCA.

Finally, the following amendments to the PCA Book of Church Order, which had been approved by the General Assembly, were approved by the Presbytery for a final vote at the next General Assembly. There is a link to the full text of the amendments on the Church Website.

- ITEM 1: Amend BCO 12-6 and 13-4 to allow Presbyteries and Sessions to establish rules for holding virtual meetings.
- ITEM 2: Amend BCO 16 by adding a clause that prohibits ordination of men who self-identify as "gay Christians," "same sex attracted Christians," "homosexual Christians," "or like terms."
- ITEM 3: Amend BCO 20-4, 24-3, and 24-4 regarding election of pastor, associate pastor, and officers.
- ITEM 4: Amend BCO 21-4; 24-1 clarifying moral requirements for church office.
- ITEM 5: Amend BCO 22-2 regarding process for Assistant to Associate Pastor.
- ITEM 6: Amend BCO 24-1 to clarify that a session has discretion on the timing of some parts of the exam of officer nominees.
- ITEM 7: Amend BCO 32-20 regarding time considerations for offenses.
- ITEM 8: Amend BCO 38-1 regarding confession document for case without process.

Please continue to pray for your Church and Presbytery, that we may work together for the sake of the gospel and the building up of Christ's Church.

Brandon & Erin Haan ~ RUF University of MN Ways to Pray

We've been working hard to reach new students and to find new avenues to bring the gospel message to the campus. Would you pray for these requests?

- As a staff and a leadership team, we're tired from the big push at the beginning of the semester. Pray that God would sustain us as we continue to minister to those within our ministry.
- While our numbers have grown, we still struggle to gather all the students in our ministry together for large events, which is vital for our health and outreach. Pray that we can help students connect with one another, and that they would see the importance of Christian community.
- Students are having more difficulty dealing with problems or adversity than in years past. For us it means that we do more counseling than normal, and students stop coming to events more easily. Pray that we would have the stamina to meet with students personally, and they would hear the challenge to continue to prioritize their faith in Jesus.

This is the first year both of our boys have been in school! Theo started kindergarten, and so far has been loving it. He enjoys learning (just like Erin), but his favorite part of school is gym (just like me, ha!). Everett is in Preschool two mornings a week, which means that Erin gets a total of 4 hours to herself! Erin is doing well with the change in schedule as a stay at home mom. She continues to do well post-treatment, although she still has some neuropathy in her feet, which can flair up sometimes. I have been preaching regularly at our home church while we are without a pastor, and I've also been asked to fill in at two other churches who are searching for their next pastor.

After months (and sometimes years) of walking with people through applying, joining Beyond, pre-field training and partnership development, it's exciting when they get close to launching. Brittney signed up for Perspectives, a 15 week long class looking at God's heart for all people groups and the spread of the gospel. It changed her perspective! She realized she needed to be all about making disciples of unreached peoples. She also met some Beyond members at the class and applied. One of the first things we asked her to do was Phase 1 training: learning how to make disciples who reproduce disciples here. Even though she felt inadequate at times, she reached out to strangers at Walmart and connected with Muslims at an Islamic Center in her town, beside making disciples in her own network of relationships. Now she's ready to move to South Asia, home to more unreached people and unreached people groups than any other region in the world.

Taste and See That the Lord is Good

Chicken Tortilla Soup

Candice Osborn

1 c chopped onion

Black olives, chopped

3 cloves garlic, minced

Shredded cheddar cheese

3-4 Serrano peppers (to taste)3-4 c diced cooked chicken

Sour Cream Tortilla Chips

2 - 12-oz cans mushroom soup

2 - 12 -oz cans cream of chicken soup

1 1/2 qts chicken broth (6 cups)

1 Tbsp chili powder (to taste)

2-3 10-oz cans Rotel tomatoes

1 can black beans, rinsed and drained (optional)

6-8 flour tortillas cut into strips (small tortillas)

In a large kettle sauté the onion, garlic, and Serrano peppers (optional) in a small amount of butter or olive oil, Add chicken, soups, broth, chili powder, Rotel tomatoes and black beans (optional). Heat almost to a boil. Turn down to simmer. Stir frequently. 5-10 minutes before serving add the tortilla strips. (A pizza cutter works great for this). Place soup in bowls and garnish with black olives, shredded cheddar cheese, sour cream, and crushed tortilla chips as desired. This is a delicious soup for those cold days coming soon!! This makes a large batch of soup. So each time Candice heats this up, she adds a few more tortilla strips. Candice would make this often for her husband Darrell as it was a favorite of his. Her son-in-law and grandson also list this as a favorite of theirs.

Pastor Sayler closed the meeting in prayer at 9:15 pm.


